Job Description

Michael Hall School is looking for a creative and talented Craft Teacher to teach Basketry. We are looking for a Teacher who is able to teach as part of our Upper School craft rotation. Experience of Waldorf Education is desirable, although not essential, but the openness to learn and develop these skills is important. This post is a part time position.

The successful applicant will:

- Be knowledgeable of the craft, with teaching experience

- Differentiate in an innovative and creative way

Basketry course

The aim of this course is to introduce the students to the craft of basket making and identify different types of materials used by basket makers all over the world. Centre-cane material is used and the students learn about where this is grown and how else it can be used. Students work on a round-shaped basket, learning how to prepare and handle the material and tools used in basket making. The students start at the base, measure and cut the sticks, tie and weave around the slath, insert side stakes and work up the sides, learning several basic weaving techniques. They will have clear vision of the finished shape, the ability to maintain an even tension, care in positioning the stakes and making adjustments where necessary. All essential skills to achieve symmetry in basket making.
