

Roles and Responsibilities:

- Assist the Lead Saplings Teacher in creating a warm, nurturing, and harmonious environment that supports the healthy development of young children.
- Support the setting and the children in daily routines, including meal times, rest periods, and outdoor activities, fostering a sense of rhythm and security.
- Engage children in meaningful, imaginative play experiences that stimulate their creativity and imagination, in line with Waldorf pedagogy.
- Foster healthy social interactions and emotional well-being among children, providing gentle guidance and support as needed.
- Assist in the preparation and organization of materials and resources for daily activities, ensuring a clean and inviting classroom environment.
- Collaborate with the Saplings Group Leader and other colleagues to develop and implement age-appropriate curriculum activities that align with Waldorf educational principles.
- Support children's physical development through outdoor play, nature walks, and



gross motor activities, promoting a strong connection to the natural world.

- Maintain strong professional boundaries with parents, colleagues and within the community in alignment with our Staff Code of Conduct.
- Attend staff meetings, Waldorf UK networking meetings, workshops, and professional development opportunities to deepen understanding of Waldorf education and enhance teaching practices.
